A Middlestown man wanted since 2012 was apprehended Tuesday in Harrisburg.

Bradley James Ross, 34, was arrested by the Harrisburg Police Street Crimes Unit after Middlestown police received information indicating he could be found in the City.

Ross, who has known addresses both the 400 block of Aspen Street in Middlestown and in the first block of South 15th Street in Harrisburg, was wanted in connection with an October 2012 incident in which he is alleged to have assaulted a Middlestown woman in her home in the 400 block of Aspen Street.

According to court documents, Ross spit in the woman's face, shoved on to a staircase and twice strangled the woman from behind. Ross is also alleged to have kept the woman captive in her home for four hours and threatening to kill her.

Ross was taken into custody without incident and transported to the new Dauphin County Judicial Center for arraignment on charges of Aggravated Assault, Simple Assault, False Imprisonment, and Terroristic. He was committed to Dauphin County prison in lieu of \$250,000 bail.
