PennDOT to Replace Several Pipes under Schoolhouse Road *Schoolhouse Road to be closed June 12-16, 7:00 AM – 4:00 PM*

Harrisburg, PA – Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) Dauphin County maintenance crews are scheduled to replace several drainage pipes under Schoolhouse Road east of Route 743 in Conewago Township. This section of Schoolhouse Road, officially designated State Route 2013, averages more than 425 vehicles traveled daily.

PennDOT advises motorists that Schoolhouse Road will be closed to through traffic from 7:00 AM – 4:00 PM, Monday, June 12, through Friday, June 16, between Cedar Road and Gates Road while crews remove and replace four 18-inch plastic pipes under the roadway near Hoffer Creek. During the closure, a detour which follows Cedar and Gates roads will be available for motorists.

Crews will return later this summer to replace five additional drainage pipes north of Bachmanville Road near the Dauphin-Lebanon county line. This work is in preparation for a seal coat operation on the entire section of roadway between Route 743 and the Dauphin-Lebanon county line that is scheduled for the Spring of 2018.

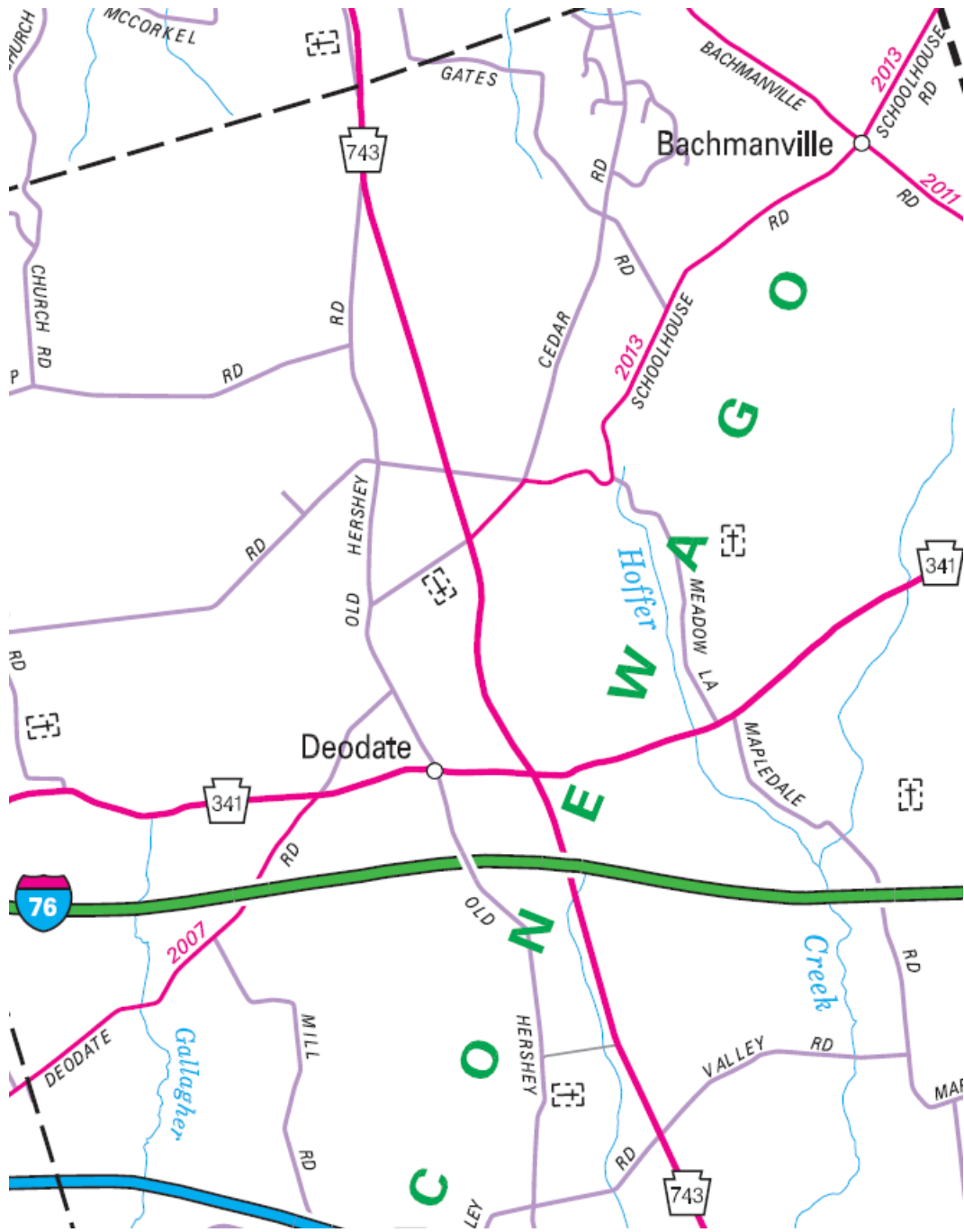
