



Do NOT Place Pool Chemicals in Your Curbside Trash & Recycling Bins!

Pool Chemicals are Considered Hazardous Waste

Penn Waste would like to issue a reminder to residents in south central Pennsylvania that pool chemicals should NOT be disposed of in your curbside trash and recycling bins. Pool chemicals are considered hazardous waste and need to be disposed of properly. Here are several options for getting rid of pool chemicals:

1. Take them to a facility that handles hazardous waste. Make sure you check with your local solid waste authority to see if they accept pool chemicals prior to arriving.

2. Check with the pool store you originally bought them from to see if they have a disposal method.
3. Donate them to a community pool or your neighbors who have pools.
4. Shock your pool by dumping the left over pool chemicals in before you close it for the season.
